### 8TH ASIAN EVALUATION WEEK (AEW) WAS SUCCESSFULLY HELD IN THAILAND

ADB Independent Evaluation Department's flagship knowledge-sharing event co-organized with Asia-Pacific Finance and Development Institute on 11-14 Sep 2023 in Thailand titled 'Beyond recovery: evaluation for development effectiveness' with 212 participants from various organizations across **58 countries**.

### THE FINDINGS OF THE "LIGHT MID-TERM EVALUATION" YOUNG AND EMERGING EVALUATORS (YEE) INTERNSHIP 2023

The Mongolian Evaluation Association in partnership with EvalYouth Mongolia Chapter and YOUTHinc Young Mongolian Professionals Association launched the Young and Emerging Evaluators Internship Program for Mongolian youth aged 18-34 in the March of 2023. The internship program is halfway through and we have initiated a 'Light Midterm Evaluation' to learn the progress so far against the objectives and course correct in the remaining time.

Within the scope of the Memorandum of Understanding between American University (AU) and Mongolian Evaluation Association, an external evaluation team consisting of a national young and emerging evaluator - Ms. Munkh-Uchral, and Ms. Jennifer Ottolino, Ms. Nada Mousa, and Ms. Shelli Golson-Mickens, who are international experienced evaluators of AU Measurement & Evaluation Program are carrying out this light midterm evaluation as probono.



### HERE ARE SOME FINDINGS OF THE "LIGHT MID-TERM EVALUATION" YOUNG AND EMERGING EVALUATORS (YEE) INTERNSHIP 2023

### ENGAGEMENT

Overall, the survey results suggest that interns are highly engaged with the program, look forward to activities and are participating in them, and retain and share evaluation-related information.

### **APPLYING SKILLS IN REAL WORD**

While interns are participating and learning in the program, they may be lacking opportunities to test and apply their skills in real-world evaluations.

### WORK-LIFE BALANCE

Even though 45% of participants expressed that the amount of time required for the program was reasonable, some seemed to struggle to maintain work–life balance and are looking forward to a lighter load in the next phase of the program.

### **EVALUATION CAREER**

Less than half of the survey participants plan to pursue a career in evaluation is puzzling and warrants further investigation.




### FOR DEVELOPING "CODE OF ETHICS FOR EVALUATION IN THE ASIA PACIFIC REGION"
