Team Progresso, representing Mongolia, successfully participated in the World Evaluation Case Competition, and was announced **ASIA CHAMPION.** 

This year, the team tackled a challenging and impactful case involving All for Armenia (AfA), a not-for-profit organization dedicated to supporting refugees displaced by ongoing conflicts between Armenia and Azerbaijan. The team's task was to develop a comprehensive proposal for expanding AfA's internal evaluation capacity to enhance its programming, which includes emergency aid, educational initiatives, and long-term community development projects for displaced individuals in Armenia.



This experience was an incredible opportunity for the team to apply their knowledge of evaluation theory in a realworld, high-stakes context, and contribute to the growth of a critical organization working on the frontlines of humanitarian aid.

# Signed MoU with Center for Evidence-based Social Science of Lanzhou University




Ms.Erdenechimeg Ulziisuren, Founder & President Mongolian of the Evaluation delivered a Association presentation on "Evaluator's Competency Framework, Norms, Standards, and Ethics" at the 'Evidence-based Sciences and Knowledge Translation Forum 2024' organized by the Lanzhou University students.

Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Mongolian Evaluation Association and Center for Evidence-based social Science of Lanzhou University for 5 years of partnership on November 9, 2024 in Lanzhou, China. The purpose of the MOU is to further strengthen academic exchanges, talent training, and collaborative research between the two institutions, and to jointly promote the research, application, and dissemination of evaluation for evaluators of Mongolia and China.









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### "Elevating Tsaatan Voices: Sowing the Seed of Indigenous Evaluation in Mongolia" conducted field data collection

From November 9th to 11th, 2024, members of the Mongolian Evaluation Association (MEA), as part of the project "Elevating Tsaatan (Reindeer People) Voices: Sowing the Seed of Indigenous Evaluation in Mongolia," conducted field data collection in the Tsagaannuur soum and the West Taiga Tribe of Khuvsgul aimag. This initiative is part of a seed grant awarded to MEA "Indigenous Evaluation for the Knowledge Transfer Activities for the Asia Pacific Region" by the Asia Pacific Evaluation Association and EvalIndigenous for the 2024-2025 period.



Key activities during the visit included:

- A Participatory Evaluation workshop for Tsaatan community representatives.
- A focus group discussion with 16 participants.
- Individual interviews with elder members in Tsagaannuur soum and families in the East Taiga Tribe.
- Participation from government representatives, who provided valuable insights on the project's objectives.



The project aims to empower the Tsaatan community to actively engage in the development and evaluation of conservation policies in their region. During the field visit, the MEA team deepened their understanding of the Tsaatan people and had the opportunity to experience the breathtaking winter landscape of the Mongolian Taiga.

Since becoming an MEA member in August 2023, Dolgor has actively engaged in various initiatives, including participating in the 2nd Summer Evaluation Bootcamp, which connected emerging evaluators from Mongolia and China. She has also supported MEA's operations and played a key role in organizing capacity-building events.

With over 13 years of experience across government, local, and international nongovernmental organizations, Dolgor serves as the Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning (MEAL) Officer for the Non-Communicable Disease project at ADRA Mongolia. She is also involved as a researcher for the CELEBRATIONS! Mongolia implementation study, a collaborative effort by ADRA International, the School of Public Health at Loma Linda University (USA), and Mongolia's National Center for Mental Health.

Prior to joining ADRA Mongolia, Dolgor worked as a Senior Researcher with the Young Researchers Supporting Foundation NGO. There, she led efforts to develop innovative approaches to social systems engineering and coordinated over 20 studies focusing on areas such as the Constitution, education, health, social protection, smart cities, start-ups, and innovation ecosystems.
