SUMMARY

- -Grassroots initiative built the **Community in Evaluation** contributed by: time, experience, efforts, expertise, insights, and interests
- -Organizational **formalization is established**: Legally registered, Vision, Mission, Strategy plan, efficient communication through email, website, publicization through social media channels, membership fee, finance management, monthly newsletter and annual report
- -Initial steps taken to strengthen **institutionalization**: organized events in partnership with different stakeholders from government, international partner, member institutions, and in collaboration with national and international partners, allies and individuals



LESSONS LEARNED

- -Having a clear vision, mission and strategy from the onset of a VOPE have served like a guiding star and protective mechanism from deviating from our purpose. MEA serves a a professional association creating a platform for the evaluators, not compete with individual evaluators
- -Pursuing and nurturing transparent communication of all of our activities with our members, national and international stakeholders through regular newsletters, email and social media channels have built their trust for our VOPE
- -Taking proactive parts in global campaigs like 'gLOCAL' and 'Youth in Evaluation Week' has proven to be an accelerator of evaluation. The reason is that because of its global nature, youth are drawn to evaluation, organizations take the opportunity to commit to support youth in evaluation along with other hundreds of organizations at the same time.
- -Contributing to regional and global task forces such of APEA's and IOCE's create excellent opportunities for our members to learn from other VOPEs and to contribute about Mongolia's cases in the development of evaluation professionalization and institutionalization
- -Because it is a volunteer organization, financial aspect is always challenge to fund our various events for the members, therefore applying for grant proposals and reaching out potential partners and sponsors is always a good practice.
- -Board members carrying the biggest chunk of the loads of all the works MEA have been carrying was given in the initial couple of years, though, transition to releasing board members from day-to-day and administrative tasks to more envisioning their vision and national and international networks will have to take place for the sustainability purpose.
- -There is a need to expand outreach efforts and activities in local language and expand to rural communities nationwide.
