PARTICIPATION IN THE ASIAN EVALUATION WEEK 2024

The Asian Evaluation Week (AEW) is a leading platform for evaluation knowledge sharing in the Asia and Pacific region, bringing together government officials, representatives of international organizations, and evaluation experts to exchange knowledge, share experiences, and learn about the latest innovations in evaluation. This year's AEW took place in Shanghai, China, from September 2-5, 2024. Representing the Mongolian Evaluation Association (MEA), two delegates—Founder and President Ms. Erdenechimeg Ulziisuren and Board Member Ms. Uugantsetseg Gonchigdorj—attended the AEW.

Ms. Erdenechimeg delivered presentations at two panel sessions: "Transforming Evaluation Practices in the Asia Pacific through Professionalizing Regional Standards and Code of Ethics," along with other leaders from the Asia Pacific Evaluation Association (APEA), and "Leveraging Evaluation Capacity Development for Strengthening Transparency and Good Governance," where she presented on Mongolia's evaluation capacity development efforts.

THINKING GLOBALLY GOING LOCALLY



Mongolian Evaluation Association (MEA) has been selected for the "Indigenous Evaluation Knowledge Transfer Activities for the Asia Pacific Region" seed grant for 2024-2025 by the Asia Pacific Evaluation Association. With the project award letter now approved, the project team has begun their initiative.

The project, titled "Elevating Tsaatan Voices: Sowing the Seeds of Indigenous Evaluation in Mongolia," focuses on the Tsaatan people, a reindeer-herding community residing in the northernmost part of Mongolia near the Russian border. The project aims to empower the Tsaatan community to actively participate in the formulation and evaluation of conservation policies in their region.

A team of 4 MEA members along with a local indigenous collaborator is leading the initiative. Currently, the team has decided on a field date and is working on translating the toolkit executive summary.

MEA is delighted to announce our national team to partake in the World Evaluation Case Competition in 2024. Team Mongolia has been named Asia Champion for the past 2 years. This year, we are excited to introduce our incredible team of YEEs who will be representing Mongolia in this year's WECC. Each member brings a unique set of skills, knowledge, and passion for evaluation that we are confident will shine throughout the competition.
