National Evaluation Capacity Index Launch Training









On March 21, 2025, the National Evaluation Capacity Index (INCE) was successfully launched in Mongolia, kicking off an introductory training on March 21, 2025. Around 730 officials from 164 public and private sector organizations attended the training organized by the Monitoring and Evaluation Department of the Authority for Government Supervisory, in collaboration with the Mongolian Evaluation Association and DEval. The training aimed to introduce the INCE tool to all stakeholders, including government agencies, ministries, the private sector, CSOs, and international organizations. It also highlighted INCE's alignment with the Government of Mongolia's goal 2024–2028 to develop "Design, Monitoring, and Evaluation (DME)" system and provided guidance on participation. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A.

Munkhchimeg Erdenebileg is one of the first members of MEA. She is a co-founder and former co-leader of EvalYouth Mongolia Chapter. She obtained a Bachelor's degree in financial management in Mongolia and fulfilled a Master's degree in MSc Management (Business Analytics) in the UK. After completing her postgraduate degree, Ms. Munkhchimeg worked at UN FAO for three years as a Finance and Administrative Officer and Monitoring and Reporting Specialist for UNCCD-funded and EU-funded projects respectively. During her time at UN FAO, she was keen to explore opportunities and develop skills related to monitoring and evaluation of the project implementation. Hence, besides working in the project implementation unit, she independently studied and completed UN ILO's "Monitoring and Evaluation Certification" programme. Ms. Erdenebileg considered this course a vital learning hub and resource to self-assess your own knowledge and understanding of monitoring, evaluation, reporting and learning principles and skills. However, after joining the MEA community, she realized that being in the network of sectoral professionals and communicating with them through shared mission was a 'humane' relationship and ignited 'personal development'. Although Ms. Munkhchimeg is making a career shift to the design field (interior/ exterior design, human-centred design, Anthropocene), she can confidently say that the core value of 'evaluation'- looking at things from different and many angles and perspectives- is a vital skill in any sector and industry.
