Baasandorj, of Authority of Government Head Supervisory, morning meeting organized amongst representatives of government, international organizations, academia and evaluation association to hear the the feedback on the concept and draft of the Resolution N.206 on "Monitoring & Evaluation of Policy Documents" and to have constructive discussion on how we can collaborate and contribute to develop national evaluation system.





The Authority of Government Supervisory organized the 'GOVERNMENT PRODUCTIVITY AND MONITORING & EVALUATION DISCUSSION' forum

With representation spanning 16 Ministries, 21 provinces, and various relevant sectors, a gathering of 240 delegates took place. The event facilitated comprehensive learning and discussion on the current M&E landscape, future trends, and global practices.

During the event, Ms. Mendbayar Budee, Chair of the Organizational and System Evaluation Topical Interest Group (TIG) of the Mongolian Evaluation Association, along with her role in USAID Mongolian Energy Governance Program, shared insights on 'Effective Monitoring.' Ms. Erdenechimeg, Founder & President of the Mongolian Evaluation Association, highlighted "National Evaluation System and International Examples." Both also served as panelists.

Her decision to enter the evaluation field was inspired by her involvement with a political think tank focused on interdisciplinary research and training in cooperation with public institutions. This engagement revealed deficiencies in state policy execution at various stages, prompting her entry into the evaluation sector. Her goal is to facilitate evidence-based policy formulation and implementation, enhancing policy accountability, transparency, and societal well-being.
